#### A Word to the Wise

All extremes are to be encouraged. Not always, of course, but at this period. Some ages are lukewarm and complacent, and then it is our business to soothe them faster asleep. Other ages, of which the present is one, are unbalanced and prone to faction, and it is our business to inflame them.

How? By treating patriotism as part of religion until, under the influence of a partisan spirit, the adherents come to regard patriotism as the most important part. Then quietly and gradually nurse them on to the stage at which religion becomes merely part of the "cause," in which Christianity is valued chiefly because of the excellent arguments it can produce in favor of a partisan agenda.

The attitude which you want to guard against is that in which temporal affairs are treated primarily as material for obedience. Once you have made the World an end, and faith a means, you have almost won your battle, and it makes very little difference what kind of worldly end is being pursued.

Provided that meetings, pamphlets, policies, movements, causes, and crusades, matter more than prayers and sacraments and charity, you have won. And the more "religious" the more secure the victory.

These words are part of a letter published in a church magazine in 1941, in London. It is part of a series of letters, 31 in all, one for each day of the month, written by C. S. Lewis. These letters were collected and published in one of his most popular books, *The Screwtape Letters*, February 1942.

The letters portray Hell as a bureaucracy. Lewis took great pleasure in working out the kind of advice that the shrewd Screwtape might give to the novice Wormwood about how to keep his "patient" safely out of the Enemy's hands. The idea for the letters came to Lewis while "listening" to a sermon in his parish church.



Good becomes bad and bad good, "Our Heavenly Father" is replaced with "Our Father Below," and the "Beatific Vision" that Christian mystics seek gives way to a "Miserific Vision" out of the depths of Hell and its devilish Proprietor. Not all readers got the joke: one clergyman wrote in to cancel his subscription on the grounds that the advice given by Wormwood was "not only erroneous but positively diabolical."

I was struck, upon rereading these letters (I first read them forty plus years past), with how timely they are. It seems the "devil's playbook" hasn't changed much, hasn't need ed to change because we haven't changed much. What has changed is technology, which allows extremism to be inflamed with grater alacrity.

What struck me hardest was how coming to regard patriotism as the most important part of religion until partisan politics becomes religion so accurately describes the current moment. Maybe it is time we wake up and realize this is the work of the "adversary," the one who is opposed to all that is good and true and beautiful.



#### Dear Messiah Family,


There is some wonderful news in our family that we are sharing with everyone, and we figured the newsletter is the best way to share the news with our Messiah family.

During this down time, Ricky will magically to change from our organist into our pianist. The will play the piano in the sanctuary.





This long-running and eclectic collection of fellow searchers meets every Sunday at 9:30 in the Fidelas Room in the Fellowship Hall. No expertise is required. Our



reading selections can be provided free of charge. All that is needed is a willingness to join.

Currently, the members are reading Howard Thurman's classic book-length essay, *Jesus and the Disinherited*, a piercing vision of the American church that has, in large measure, failed the African American community in the church's essential task of spreading the message of Jesus of Nazareth. The core of the book is a review of what Thurman calls the "Three Hounds of Hell:" fear, deception, and hate. He concludes with a discussion of how the only appropriate response to the attacks of the three 'hounds' is love. Our next book will be a departure from the normal selections, *The Hidden Life of Trees* by Peter Wohlleben, a German author. The book's subtle provides a glimpse into how trees feel and communicate. Maybe the fictional 'Ents' in J.R.R. Tolkien's "Ring" trilogy are not that far off the mark.
